We are female members of this church who want to minister to each other, the larger congregation, and God's church in all the ways and gifts He gave us to serve. We are multigenerational. We have young women, and...."wiser" women. We have new members to First Presbyterian and third generation members who went to Sunday School in our church. Our theme verse for the last three years has been our prayer, as a Women's Council, for what we do in this ministry...

We have many smaller committees and representatives in each who give a report once a month on how things are going.
