David & Jan Thomae will speak to the children in 4 Corners Café.





FAITH WORKING THROUGH LOVE

We are studying Hebrews 11 on Sunday mornings. It is called "The Faith Chapter," like 1 Corinthians 15

is called "The Resurrection Chapter" and 1 Corinthians 13 is called "The Love Chapter." And speaking of "love", there is interesting and vital interface between faith and love in Scripture.

Take Galatians 5:6. There Paul writes, "In Christ Jesus neither circumcision nor uncircumcision counts for anything, but only faith working through love," or as the NIV has it, "faith expressing itself through love." We can conclude that if your faith is strong your love will be strong - true love that is "patient, kind", that "does not boast...is not arrogant or rude...does not insist on its own way...is not irritable or resentful" (1 Corinthians 13:4-5).

Sadly, it is possible for any of us to hold what we think are the strongest convictions about the truths of Scripture, yet we can be rude, impatient, arrogant, resentful and irritable people. Strong convictions or not, this is not the faith Scripture talks about, faith that expresses itself in the love of 1 Corinthians 13.

Faith at its heart is convinced of the saving love of God in Christ Jesus. Faith is convinced of its own need of that saving, forgiving love. Faith is helpless and desperate, humbly and gladly clinging to Jesus Christ for salvation. You can see that out of the matrix of such faith will begin to flow a growing humility and kindness to others. Our strong conviction about God's goodness manifests itself in our growing goodness.

So, though we will be in the "faith" chapter, we will constantly connect it to the "love" chapter. And to bring our other chapter in, we must realize that no faith or love would be at all possible without the "resurrection" chapter. Just sayin'...

A new Sunday School Class for adults primarily in their 30s and 40s has begun in Currie Hall 207.


Knox and Debra Baird are leading this class.
