## REAL PROGRESS

*...work out your salvation with fear and trembling, for it is God who is at work in you, both to will and to work for His good pleasure. Philippians 2:12-13*

### **It is our responsibility to make progress in the Christian life.**

The first phrase is shocking when you first read it. The Bible teaches that we cannot save ourselves. It sounds like Paul is saying, “Save yourself – work out your own salvation.”

But “salvation” has several meanings in Scripture. Sometimes it refers to the initial rescue of sinners (Lk 7:50), sometimes it refers to our final salvation when Jesus comes again (1 Pt 1:5), and sometimes, as here, it refers to our present growth.

Scripture teaches we have been saved, we are being saved and we will be saved. We have been saved from the guilt, punishment and tyranny of sin. We are being progressively saved from the power and influence of sin. One day we’ll be saved completely and forever from the presence and misery of sin. Here Paul is saying, “Rid yourselves of sin and cultivate the character of Christ. Make progress in your salvation!”

Do it with “fear and trembling.” In general, “fear” means being in awe of God’s greatness and kindness. “Trembling” points to our own weakness. Taken together, we must have dependent and humble hearts toward God as we seek to grow.

### **But only God makes it happen**

But more specifically, in this context he says “with fear and trembling, *for it is God who is at work.*” We work out our salvation in awe of the fact that the God who made the world is actually present in our lives making us like Christ. It is *God* who is at work in you! GOD! Yes, almighty God! That *is* cause for fear and trembling! It’s cause for joy and expectation as well. Hey! This thing can really happen! Awesome!

Notice God works so that we “will and work for His good pleasure.” This means that we will *want* to do His will and we will actually *do* His will. He works from the inside out: we have the desires that please Him and real obedience that pleases Him.

Think of it, omnipotence takes up your progress in getting rid of sin and becoming like Christ. You can throw yourself into the battle, knowing that you have dominating air support and artillery fire from God that weakens and debilitates your enemy, sin, so that you can always make progress against it.

We must never give in to self-pity. We must not say, “I just can’t do anything about my sin” and leave it there. Yes, apart from Him we can do no good at all (John 15:5). *But we are not apart from him; we abide in him and he abides in us and works in us.*

God is at work in you! Sin can and will stand up to you all day, but sin cannot stand up to God’s power. Since He is at work, you be at work against it! We can do all things through Christ who strengthens us (Philippians 4:13).

### **The church – ya’ll**

And remember the context of these verses. Paul has been urging the Philippians to be humble and for each to count one another as more important than himself by having the same servant heart that Christ did when he left heaven and died on the cross (2:3-8).

Here he encourages us that we can have this kind of rich community of love and humility because God is at work in us to bring it about! If this were translated into “Mississippian” it would read, “Ya’ll work out ya’ll’s salvation because God is at work in ya’ll.”

As a church we work out our salvation by becoming a church of Christ-like humility, counting one another as more important than ourselves. This is good news: God works in us as a church so that we will have the desire and obedience to walk in this humility. Let’s work out our own salvation as a church with fear and trembling!


