


HARVEST FUND UPDATE



Listing of Design Objectives

ADMINISTRATIVE BUILDING

Office Suite

New flooring, fresh wall paint, update lighting and furnishings in Pastor office, new ceilings

Parlor

New flooring, fresh wall paint, repaint millwork details, update wall sconces, replace curtains, recover existing chairs, new couch, update lighting, repaint ceiling cove

Choir Suite

Update lighting, fresh wall paint, acoustic wall panels, music folio cabinets, projector

Restrooms

Replace flooring, update lighting, fresh wall paint, new partitions, counters, and fixtures

SANCTUARY

Nave and Corridors

Replace carpet and hard surface flooring, new lighting system, new sound system, new livestream and graphics system, new pew cushions, refinish wood platform, re-upholstered platform chairs, update wall coverings, refurbish pulpit, relocate audio/livestream equipment to floor

Narthex

Replace flooring, update wallcovering, update chandelier and accent lighting, keep stained millwork, repaint millwork panel details, new furniture

Restrooms

Replace flooring, update lighting, fresh wall paint, new partitions, counters, and fixtures

TAYLOR HALL

Multi-Purpose Room

Replace carpet, remove plexiglass and moveable walls, maintain existing stained wood finishes, repaint walls, replace acoustical treatments, update sound system, new banquet chairs

Classrooms and Hallways

Replace flooring, update lighting, update window treatments

Replace lighting, update furnishings and equipment

Replace flooring, update lighting, fresh wall paint, new partitions, counters, and fixtures



UPDATE ON FPC PASTOR SEARCH PROCESS



During a joint Sunday school class on July 27, Matthew Boyd presented an update on the Session's recommendations for the formation of a **Pastor Search Committee**. To assist in the process, the Session has engaged **McGowan Global Institute (MGI)**, a non-profit ministry known for its deep experience and strong reputation in guiding churches through senior pastor searches.

Nominations for members of the Pastor Search Committee are being accepted through August 10, with nomination forms available at the church office or in the *Grace Notes* e-newsletter. Following a review of those nominated, the Session will present a proposed slate of individuals to be voted on by the congregation on **Sunday**, **September 7** following the morning worship service.

MGI will be represented by consultant Ed Norton, a Teaching Elder in the PCA who most recently served for 25 years on staff at Independent Presbyterian Church in Memphis. Ed will provide guidance and assistance to the Pastor Search Committee throughout the selection process.

The Session has identified a representative cross-section of the congregation (non-officers) who will be invited to participate in a "Discovery Weekend Assessment" led by Rev. Norton to help in development of a profile of our church. In addition, a congregational survey will be made available to all members through a customized MGI survey portal between August 3-17. The results of the survey will also be used in preparation of a church profile.
