

# Our Story

First Presbyterian has served as a faithful Gospel witness in the Hattiesburg area for 143 years, during which time we have had only nine pastors. We marvel at the goodness and faithfulness of God! As with all churches, we have had a mixture of joys and challenges, but God has graciously sustained and grown us.

We are currently coming off a painful period in the life of our church, marked by disunity and the departure of a number of beloved former members. Yet, we are experiencing healing and reconciliation and share a renewed determination to better clarify our vision, mission, and aspirations.

We are enthusiastic, hopeful, and excited about what the Lord will do through his people at FPC in the future. We are looking forward to working alongside a lead pastor who will help guide us into greater unity and Gospel mission.



## OUR CALLING

### Vision

A church deeply formed by the Good News of Jesus Christ, experiencing and expressing God's grace together in Hattiesburg.

First Presbyterian Church of Hattiesburg exists in the heart of Hattiesburg to be a community deeply formed by the Gospel, not simply as individuals, but together. Our identity is grounded in grace; we receive it, are changed by it, and offer it to one another and to our city. We believe that the grace of God is not abstract but something we experience and express tangibly in worship, in community life, and in mission.

We desire to be a people who reflect God's renewing presence in every part of church life: in worship that is both doxological — directed toward God — and communal — building up one another; in deep, authentic community; and in outward service to the world. This threefold orientation is foundational. When aligned, it fosters a vibrant church culture that is joyful, hospitable, honest, and generous, deeply rooted in God's Word and



uniquely suited to our place and time in Hattiesburg.

We envision a church where every person, no matter his or her starting point, is welcomed into a process of spiritual formation, shaped over time by worshiping, living, and serving together in the grace of God.




## OUR MINISTRIES

#### Children

FPC's children's ministry is one of our biggest strengths, drawing young families to our church. Always seeking to find creative ways to engage our children with the Gospel, the children's ministry is showing the love of Christ to and making a difference in the lives of our covenant children.

Using curriculum from Great Commission
Publications, we seek to nurture and instruct
children age 2 to 6th grade in God's Word,
teaching them the Bible as the true revelation of God's
plan of redemption and encouraging them to see
their need of a Savior by faith alone in Christ alone
to the glory of God alone.



A highlight each year is Vacation Bible School when typically 300 children from within and without the church hear the gospel through creative means. We are currently using a curriculum based on The Chronicles of Narnia.



### Students

Those children then enter the Student Ministry in 7th grade well-grounded in Biblical knowledge and eager to participate in the ministry of the church. The focus of our Student Ministry is to disciple our students as they grow in grace and seek to become more Christlike.

Students in 7th - 12th grades meet for fellowship, singing, and Bible study on Wednesday nights during the fall and spring and have opportunities to participate in small group studies, youth retreats, and community service projects throughout the year.

#### Women

The wisdom and unique giftedness of women in their various stages of life are highly valued and relied upon in our church. Women serve alongside men in various ministries and committees.

We seek to encourage women in their walks with Christ by holding weekly Bible studies,



social and special events, as well as many service opportunities. Our women find great joy in showing hospitality as well as supporting ministries such as Reformed University Fellowship and Palmer Home for Children.



### Senior Adults

Comprising 15% percent of our membership, senior adults are treasured members of this body of believers. First Presbyterian Church ministers to our senior adults through regular times of food, fellowship and Bible study.

#### Music

We are grateful for a joyful and vibrant music ministry that invites everyone to join in worship through song. At the heart of our services is the voice of the congregation — the most important instrument we have!

We cherish the timeless hymns and songs of our Reformed and Presbyterian tradition, while also embracing newer



music that reflects our faith and theology. Our worship is richly supported by instrumental accompaniment including piano, organ, and other instruments that enhance and support congregational singing.

Our Sanctuary Choir helps lead the congregation each Sunday morning, and our children are encouraged to lift their voices too through our children's choirs. There's a place for every voice in our worship!

#### Adult Education

FPC has a number of excellent and gifted teachers. We currently have a variety of Sunday school classes, both mixed gender and gender specific. This includes classes for college students, singles and young adults, and special needs adults. We also offer Bible study on Wednesday evenings.

### Gollege Ministry

Our partnership with Reformed University Fellowship dates back to 1973 when the first RUF chapter began at the University of Southern Mississippi. We enthusiastically support this ministry and aspire to welcome more students to worship and fellowship with us during their college years.

### Small Groups

We dedicate one Sunday evening each month for fellowship groups, providing opportunities for members to build relationships, share life together, and grow in faith. Each group is guided by an elder and has the flexibility to set its own meeting schedule. This is a ministry area we aspire to strengthen.



#### Missions

From its beginning, FPC has been a missions-minded church. We currently support nearly 60 missionaries and organizations as a way of extending the Gospel into our world. We also believe that our response to the Gospel involves praying and going as well as giving; therefore, we sponsor local and international mission trips, develop connections with our missionaries through regular reports, and have hosted an annual missions conference for over 50 years.

Local mercy ministries we support include The Lighthouse Rescue Mission (home for women and children) and Christian Services (help and support for the poor). We seek to bring a gospel witness to bear in our community by partnering with a local public school

in an underresourced area that is named for one of our first members (in 1903!).

Fifteen percent of our 2025 budget goes to support local, national, and international ministries.



# OUR COMMUNITY

The population of Hattiesburg is approximately 50,000 with approximately 150,000 in the Pine Belt region. The University of Southern Mississippi has approximately 16,000 students and William Carey University has approximately 4,400 students.

Hattiesburg is called the "Hub City" due to its proximity to Jackson, New Orleans, and the Gulf Coast.

First Presbyterian Church
is in Grace Presbytery
and one of three
PCA churches in the city.
Our campus is situated on 11 acres
along Hardy Street/U.S. 98,
the primary east-west corridor
through Hattiesburg.

#### **Schools**

FPC families send their children to Forrest County or Lamar County public schools, homeschool, or private school.

Presbyterian Christian School,

a K-12th grade school

with a lovely campus

approximately 15 minutes

from the church.

Hattiesburg is home to

Camp Shelby (a major military base),
and two sprawling medical facilities,

Forrest General Hospital
and Merit Health Wesley.

Residents enjoy rich arts and cultural events as well as sporting events.

The Longleaf Trace (pictured)
is a 41-mile stretch that runs
from downtown Hattiesburg
westward to Prentiss.
It is perfect for walking,
running, or biking.
