"A Paradigm for our Prayers"

Philippians 1:9-11

1. Pray for abounding love marked by
  - a. Knowledge and discernment and
  - b. The approval of what really counts
2. So we'll be
  - a. Sincere and blameless for the day of Christ
  - b. Filled with the fruit of righteousness
    - (1) That comes from Christ
    - (2) And brings glory and praise to God

1 Thessalonians 3:12-13

And may the Lord make you increase and abound in love for one another and for all, as we do for you, so that he may establish your hearts blameless in holiness before our God and Father, at the coming of our Lord Jesus with all his saints.

Ephesians 4:29

Let no corrupting talk come out of your mouths, but only such as is good for building up, as fits the occasion, that it may give grace to those who hear.

Colossians 4:5-6

Walk in wisdom toward outsiders, making the best use of the time. Let your speech always be gracious, seasoned with salt, so that you may know how you ought to answer each person.
